Leadership and Professional Studies

Previous or new coursework in Military science, Leadership, and/or Business in the areas of leadership and professional studies.

Liberal Arts and Social Sciences

Previous or new coursework in Communications, English, History, Music, Philosophy, Theatre, Art, Anthropology, Criminal Justice, Economics, Political Science, Sociology and/or Social Work.

Teaching and Learning

Previous or new coursework in Education, Sociology, Philosophy, and/or Psychology in the areas of teaching and learning.

To complete a concentration, students must earn 12 credit hours of courses in their concentration area as part of their Area V and Area VI major electives. Previous and transfer coursework can be counted toward a concentration. Concentration courses may also count toward major requirements.
